Why Fall Exterior Maintenance Matters

Fall is the perfect time to prepare your home for the colder months ahead. Taking a few simple steps now can save time, money, and stress later.

By managing these tasks now, you're not only showing your community pride but also protecting your property, keeping your home safe, and keeping curb appeal all season long. A little prevention now goes a long way toward avoiding major repairs in the future. September and October are the perfect times to enjoy the fresh air while inspecting your home and performing fall home maintenance.

Roof & Gutters

Inspect the roof for damaged or missing shingles.

Clean gutters and downspouts to prevent clogs and improve functioning.

Ensure downspouts extend away from the foundation.

Consider a light pressure washing of the roof to remove stains.

Siding, Walls & Windows

Check siding for cracks, holes, or loose panels.

Wash siding to remove dirt and mildew.

Inspect caulking and weatherstripping around windows/doors, reseal if needed.

Clean windows before winter storms.

Yard & Landscaping

Rake and remove fallen leaves throughout the season.

Trim trees and shrubs away from the house and roofline.

Prune trees, shrubs, and other plants as needed.

Protect sensitive plants if needed.

Edge, remove weeds, prune, and remove dead landscaping. Add mulch or straw as needed to the planting beds.

Aerate, fertilize, and seed the lawn.

Check your mailbox and post to ensure they are in good working order.

Driveways, Walkways & Hardscapes

Inspect driveways, patios, and walkways for cracks; seal if necessary.

Pressure wash driveways, patios, and decks to remove unsightly mold, algae growth, and rust stains.

Store or cover outdoor furniture, grills, and equipment.

Plumbing & Irrigation

Shut off and drain outdoor faucets and irrigation systems for winter.

Store hoses to prevent cracking.

Lighting & Safety

Test outdoor lighting, replace burnt bulbs.

Adjust timers for shorter daylight hours.

Check railings, steps, and walkways for safety hazards.

Pests & Winter Prep

Seal small gaps to keep rodents and insects from entering.

Store firewood away from the house.

Ensure snow removal tools and supplies (salt, shovels) are ready- just in case!

Larger Projects Riding the Tide

Each day, we coordinate and perform minor repairs across both campuses. However, larger projects are very visible and may disrupt traffic, and we'd like to make you aware of those... Lighting- The power supply line was replaced at the River Club pool.

Signage- Project to clean and repair signage across both ocean side and River Club campuses will continue over the next several months. The replacement sign for the rotting south gate entry has been ordered.

Drainage- Reviewing drainage concerns and performing maintenance work as needed.

Tennis/Pickleball Courts- We are awaiting the vendor to inspect the courts for cracks/damages and investigating lighting repairs and/or replacements.

Guard Shack- Inspections underway for repairs/maintenance needed to ocean side campus facilities.

Oceanside Paver Crossovers- Scheduling repairs over cooler months when less likely to interfere with traffic.

Fishing Pier/Boardwalk- New landscape lights were ordered and pending receipt for installation. Once these lights are repaired, we will move on to inspect the other areas of low-voltage lighting in the community.

Beach Club Deck- We are awaiting the results of a recent comprehensive inspection for the Board to review. This will guide any repairs needed that are not already completed.

Sun Shades- We will be inspecting the posts, performing any needed painting/repairs and replacing the sails (new sails will be made).

Streetlight/Camera at South Entrance- Hit by driver earlier this week. A police report was filed, and we are obtaining materials for replacement.

Irrigation Mapping- Project is almost completed. Vendor is conferring with LBTS main system vendor.

Fence- Boundary chain link fence at the end of South Dunes Drive in the Charlestowne Grant section will be inspected for repairs next week.

Traffic Guides- Replacement traffic guides have arrived and will be installed over the next few weeks.

Completed Landscape Work

Turf grass and pond perimeter maintenance. General trimming/edging. Ornamental detailing around beach club house. Removal of vines and trimming of jasmine. Weeds were sprayed throughout LBTS- kept areas. Weekly inspection (adjustments as needed) of LBTS-maintained irrigation systems. Irrigation repairs performed as needed.

Tropical Pina Colada Popsicles

A frozen twist on the classic tropical cocktail, these pina colada popsicles are the perfect way to enjoy a beach day. With the rich taste of coconut and pineapple, plus a hint of rum (if you like), these popsicles offer the ultimate beach treat that everyone can enjoy—adults and kids alike.

Ingredients:

2 cups of pineapple chunks (fresh or frozen)

1 cup coconut milk

1/3 cup white rum (optional)

2 tbsp honey or agave syrup

1 tsp vanilla extract

Pineapple slices or shredded coconut for garnish (optional)

Instructions:

Blend pineapple chunks, coconut milk, rum, honey, and vanilla extract in a blender until smooth. Pour the mixture into popsicle molds, leaving a little space at the top. Insert sticks and freeze for at least 4 hours, or until fully set. To release, run warm water over the outside of the molds for a few seconds and gently pull out the popsicles. These tropical popsicles are a refreshing, fun way to enjoy the flavors of a pina colada in a kid-friendly form. The coconut and pineapple combo is a natural choice for a beach vibe, and the touch of rum (optional) makes them extra festive.
