## **Association Reminders:**

-Please make sure all payments are mailed to the Georgia address (located in the very back of the coupon book) P.O. Box 240 Commerce, GA 30529.

-The old address and payment drop box at Waccamaw Management (41 Maintenance Road) is no longer available for drop off. All checks must be made payable to "Litchfield-By-The-Sea Community Association, Inc. or LBTS. We cannot accept checks made payable to other entities. -We have received the final owner statements from Waccamaw Management and CINC System's accounting team is uploading any account credits or debits that remained on their system. We expect to complete the process by 02/05/2025.

-We are pleased to announce that we will be offering Free E checks for the remainder of the year! After 12/31/2025 there will be a fee of \$1.99 for each check processed. However, the free ACH Program is returning!

-Be on the lookout for the ACH forms next week! As you may recall, those who were enrolled in the free ACH program (a monthly debit automatically from your bank account that also adjusted if the assessment amount changed) through Waccamaw Management were not able to continue the service as we transitioned. The site team has created the new free ACH portal for our owners, and it will be active for 3/1/25 payments and beyond.

Forms will be emailed and posted to the website (www.litchfieldbythesea.com) under the "Homeowner" tab on Friday 1/31/25. We will also have copies in the lobby of our building at 49 Wall Street. Forms must be submitted by the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the month prior to be effective for the next scheduled monthly payment. For example, we will need the completed form and voided check by close of business on 2/15/25 to make your March payment. Forms received after 2/15/25 will be active for April payments. If a form is incomplete, it will delay the processing.

#### Did You Know?

The first European settlement on the North American continent was in South Carolina. San Miguel de Guadalupe was founded in 1526 by Lucas Vázquez de Ayllón, probably near present-day Georgetown. The colony only survived for three months.
